Woodpeckers are some of the most fascinating birds found in Missouri's forests, parks, and even backyard trees. Missouri is home to several species, including the Downy Woodpecker, Red-bellied Woodpecker, Pileated Woodpecker, and Northern Flicker. These birds are known for pecking on tree trunks in search of insects hidden beneath the bark. Their strong beaks work like tiny jackhammers, and special shock-absorbing bones in their skulls help protect their brains from injury while pecking.

One of the most impressive Missouri woodpeckers is the Pileated Woodpecker, the largest species in the state. With its bright red crest and loud calls, it is often compared to the famous cartoon character Woody Woodpecker. Woodpeckers also play an important role in nature because the holes they create in trees later become homes for other animals such as bluebirds, owls, and squirrels.

Another interesting fact is that woodpeckers have long sticky tongues that can extend far beyond their beaks to capture ants and beetles. Their stiff tail feathers also help them balance while climbing tree trunks. These unique birds are an important and entertaining part of Missouri wildlife.

Important Rule Refresher

1. Vehicles should only be parked under the Portico in the front of the building for loading and unloading purposes. This applies to both residents and guests. It is not appropriate for vehicles to be left under the portico unattended.
